Variance re parking. Pick up window facing 62nd St. Front faces south. Concerned about wall. We prefer hedge or some kind of natural barrier, a berm with landscaping. Jodi mentioned stacking would not likely spill out onto 62nd St. Dan wants to see revised landscape plan. **Joe will share updated plans electronically. We will vote electronically.**

2023-CVR-821 / 2023-CPL-821 June 15 - 4359 E. 75th, Thomas & Cynthia Mattingly and Michael & Carly Dury. Rezone & Replat to legally establish 2 existing parcels with zero ft of street frontage and to provide for a 3rd lot, also without street frontage. Mo moved "**no contest**" (not oppose) Ted seconded. Unanimously passed to not oppose.

To move sign due to eminent domain and interstate construction. Clear Path-465. Ask for continuance. Until we get info on sign design. Don moved, Joe seconded to ask for **continuance** to get more info on sign, such as exact location & design. Unanimously voted to ask for continuance.

RR49-40143, Indy Lux Nails – New Beer & Wine Permit. Mo moved **no opposition**, Joe second. Unanimously passed

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Dan Boots: Clear path progressing through next phase. Binford where goes from city to fed interstate Trash pick-up, landfill contracts due. All vendors up for contract renewal. Opportunities to more recycling part of DPW and safety

Nickel plate outside chance contracts going. Hope to announce ground-breaking

Grant for bridge over Keystone to eventually tie into Monon Trail. Bridge would account for 80%+ of total budget Fishers handling 96^{th.} Next challenge is 82nd street and dealing with water flow. Howland Ditch. Looking at TIFFS and other funding. Perhaps using the water to incorporate the water into the aesthetics of Patterned after Monon activity center. With trail going around. Walking water park.

Epic Ultra Lounge in Castleton still wants to transfer liquor license from another location that has experienced "trouble". Dan has asked them to withdraw. Petitioner says landlord holding her hostage.

Until Clear Path is completed DPW will not make drastic traffic changes.

Sewers from septic. Winding Ridge neighborhood is gathering interest in change. Not STEP. Citizens has access to low interest loans. Andy's neighborhood also investigating.

Jodi Perras, new GACC member lives at the corner of 78th and Sherman. No HOA. Wanted speed bumps. Gravel parking lot behind school installed without any permits for the sports organizations. After construction WTS cited for no permits. Sports working with engineer. Wyandotte St. should be designated dead end and cars should not be directed through their street. She and neighbors want to be able to walk on their streets safely and have the sports groups & participants to be respectful of nearby neighbors & follow ordinances in place regarding parking lot.

79th and Dean Rd. roundabout will shut down intersection. "**Tactical urbanism**"¹ can put in ways to slow down traffic. Need a sponsor. Would GACC do that? Soccer field and baseball have a verbal agreement. School has right to evict them like (they did Dynamo). School restricts parking. 220 parking spaces illegally installed, no drainage.

Wants to restrict traffic on Wyandotte, remove parking lot. Sports organizations say they don't have \$\$\$. Have a proposal to enter from 79th. Problem is that it will go by playground.

Mo: long term solution. Expressed how GACC needs to maintain impartiality while working with both groups. Never has been enough parking.

Mo extended invitation to Jodi to consider becoming a GACC Board member.

Sue also mentioned that traffic at 79th and Allisonville is a problem. Southbound traffic often backs up through 82nd intersection.
