President: Welcome & Guest Introductions

2024-SE3-002 Reagan Outdoor Michelle Noppengerger and John Russel from Reagan. Provided handout which highlighted eminent domain and challenges of new billboard location including a 5-story hotel; angle of the V-sign & need for a wider angle to allow autos from both I-69 and I-465 to see it. This is a static vinyl sign, not electronic. The billboard location is outside I-465, not inside.

Herb Engman, IDEM's Environmental Stakeholder Inclusion Program. Provided handout. Herb will GACC send file to share with BOD.

Dan Boots & Nick Roberts – new DMV director, IMPD new Chief Christopher Bailey, New STEM school (former Church) on Michigan Road, not high school. Parks hiring. Offering signing bonus and referral bonus. Need to be hired to qualify for bonus.

DPW has hundreds of openings. CDL program – will pay for training. Must stay employed for a certain period Allison Pointe project – minority contractor of the month is an architectural firm. 8440 seeking TIFF. Site remediation to raise area 18" to 2 '. Will increase the capacity of the lake will help runoff.

Downtown curfew established for teens and it was successful. Big question: where are parents?

Nick 8235 Bash – owned by hotel. Wants to buy to rezone C4. GACC asked for continuance. Sue reached out and Staff misunderstood which petition and it was approved on March 14 then moved to March 28. David Kingen did not receive letter. Sue showed us a list of permissible asked if C4 definition can be revised. GACC committed to following Castleton Strategic Plan and the Indianapolis and control the type of businesses that go in.
